A medieval silver coin; a penny of Alexander III of Scotland (1249 – 1286), second coinage (1280 – 1286). The coin is in excellent condition. It has a diameter of 19.1mm and is 0.7mm thick. It weighs 1.4g. The four mullets each have 6 points, making it a 24 point coin. For reference see Spink's coins of Scotland, Ireland and the Islands number 5055.
