Silver circular disc, probably a bezel from a finger ring. The disc features a diademed head engraved in intaglio facing to the right. Encircling this is the retrograde and somewhat garbled legend ANTONI VIVAS IN DEO. Several of the letters are back-to-front but the meaning is relatively clear.

The formula VIVAS IN DEO is a Christian one, the translation of this inscription being 'Antonius, may you live in God'. The fact that the letters are retrograde and engraved in intaglio would have made the bezel suited for use as a signet.

Two strikingly similar silver bezels (both 10mm in diameter) with inscriptions including *Vivas* (but not *In Deo*) are known from Silchester, one with a male bust and the inscription IVL BELLATOR VIVAS, the other with a female bust and the inscription VIVAS. Both inscriptions were retrograde and thus, like this specimen, intended to be read in impression (Henig, M. *A Corpus of engraved gemstones from British sites*, BAR British Series 8 (2007), 186, nos. 786 & 787). A gold ring, most likely a betrothal gift, from Brancaster has two confronted busts with the legend VIVAS IN DEO; here the inscription is normal and so intended to be read on the metal (Henig, M. *A Corpus of engraved gemstones from British sites*, BAR British Series 8 (2007), 186-7, nos. 790).

This signet, given its overt Christian content probably belongs to the 4th or very early 5th century after Constantine's conversion to Christianity in 312. Like the Brancaster ring, it constitutes evidence for Christianity in Late Roman Norfolk.
