An incomplete copper-alloy Roman brooch of the Colchester Derivative Hinged type, dating to AD 43-120. The head is cylindrical with a transverse slot at the centre of its back; the head still houses the iron axis bar. The bow is sub-rectangular in cross-section and rather straight in profile; it meets the head at a right angle and tapers towards a broken end. The surfaces are heavily worn, pitted and corroded.
