A medieval silver cut halfpenny of William I (1066-87), Two sceptres type (North 844; BMC iv) dating to AD 1072-1074, moneyer: Authbjorn/Outhbeorn, mint: York. Ref: North 1994: 191, 196.

The coin is worn especially around the outer edge which is also lightly chipped. The cutting of the coin is diagonally across the reverse of the coin rather than following the cross arms.

Notes:

The coin appears to be die linked to the obverse of coin 872 in the Sylloge of Coins of the British Isles 29 Merseyside Museums (also on EMC as 1029.0872). It is unclear if the coin is also die-linked to the reverse of this coin.
