The entire face is decorated with a double moulded zigzagged line with a flower head in the remaining triangular cells. The two scroll-like terminals each have a large flower head. There is a broken iron pin bar across the centre on the reverse. The pin is missing. A parallel to this object could not be found at the time of writing, but has been attributed to the late 15th century based on its style.
