An Early Medieval (Anglo Saxon) copper alloy fragment of a florid cruciform brooch (late 6th century). Only the headplate and the bow are present, the foot and pin are missing. The headplate has a recessed panel decorated with a chip-carved with Style 1 interlaced motifs. There are three triangular knobs projecting from the head-plate. The knobs are also chip-carved to form full-face masks. A central bar emerges from the recessed panel on the head-plate and goes down the bow. The bar has a circular expansion with a pellet in the middle in the centre of the bow. On either side of this are two square panels carved in a similar pattern to the head-plate. There are the remains of a decorated lappet on one side. There are twin lugs on the reverse of the head-plate with the corroded iron remains of the spring and the cross bar present. The top knob has broken off and been reattached with a blackened material. The broken edge just below the bow has the same dark green patina as the rest of the surface suggesting the damage occurred in antiquity. Large amounts of thick gilding are still present.
