A copper-alloy pot leg from a large cooking or storage vessel, dating from the late medieval to post-medieval period. The leg is vaguely rectangular in profile and tapers to a small splayed foot at one end. At the other end is the remains of the join where the leg would have been attached to a vessel. The object is a mid greenish-brown mottled colour, and the surface is heavily pitted and very corroded.
