The form is reminiscent of beakers in fine reduced Upchurch-type ware which are dated to the later first century, but the similarity may be misleading, as hand-made, flint-tempered vessels generally are likely to be pre-conquest and certainly pre/early Flavian in date. Probably locally made.
