Notes:

'Gunmoney' is so called, as the coins were struck from reclaimed brass and a good source of this was often cannons. Gunmoney was issued by James II during his poorly-funded campaigns against William of Orange (William III). James II landed in Ireland in 1689, believing that support gained in Ireland would help him to regain his English crown (Went 1960). James II intended to redeem the gunmoney with silver coinage following his aspired-for military success, and this explains why the coins all feature the month of issue as well as the year. This was so that after the war, in the event of victory, the soldiers would be able to claim interest on their wages, for which proper payment had been withheld so long. Gunmoney can also be referred to as 'Money of Necessity' (Went 1960).
