**Specialist Description** 

Small penannular ring of circular cross-section comprising gold foil covering a base metal (copper alloy) core. One terminal is damaged and the foil here has lifted and split. The gold covering bears decorative stripes of yellow and paler gold but this is very worn especially at the outer circumference. External diameter 15x14mm; diameter of body 4.4mm; weight 3.4g. Composition See scientific report. Discussion A well known Later Bronze Age type, decorative in character. *c.* 1150-750BC. As the object is prehistoric and contains precious metal it qualifies as Treasure under the stipulations of the Treasure Designation Order 2002. Excerpt from Conservation Report for Coroner (9.6.10):

'Non-destructive X-ray fluorescence analysis of the surface of a striped penannular ring from Steyning, W. Sussex, for the yellow stripe indicated a gold content of approximately 80%, a silver content of approximately 18%, the remainder being copper. The gold composition of the pale stripe is several percent lower and the silver content similarly higher, but the copper content is similar. The ring weighs 3.4 grams and XRF analysis of the material inside the broken end indicates that it has a corroded bronze core.'
