A possible copper-alloy rim or leg from a medieval to post-Medieval domestic vessel. The bar is sub-rectangular, with one edge tapered; each end has been broken in antiquity, with all edges worn smooth and a matt green patina. There are several small areas of what appears to be sooting, which suggests a domestic vessel fragment. Dimensions are: Length 47.1 mm, Width 14.5 mm, Thickness 9.2 mm. Weight 33 grams.
