An incomplete cast copper alloy harness pendant of medieval date. The pendant is quatrefoil in shape with a broken attachment loop projecting from one of the outer curved edges. The pendant depicts a rampant griffin coloured with red enamel. The field around the griffin is slightly recessed and traces of blue enamel still remain. The recessed central field results in the appearance of a raised border tracing the quatrefoil edges.
The reverse of the pendant is flat and undecorated and shows signs of wear.
The metal is a mid reddish-brown colour and is worn. The pendant is 30.4 mm long, 28.7 mm wide, 2.9 mm thick and weighs 9.6 g .
