A silver medieval Venetian soldino, probably of Francesco Foscari, doge from 1423 to 1457. The obverse depicts the Doge kneeling left and holding a banner, and reads FR[A.FOSCA]RI DVX, with the mint control KQ to the right. The reverse depicts the winged and nimbate lion of St Mark facing within a circle, holding book of gospels and reads [S.MARC]VS VENETI.

Notes:

As the coin is somewhat worn and damaged, attribution to Doge Francesco Foscari is based on the only legible letters of the Doge's name, R and I. However, Foscari appears to be the only Doge whose name ends with these letters, making him the most likely candidate.

In Daubney's 2009 paper on the circulation of Venetian coinage in late Medieval England, Daubney records no known examples of Foscari's coinage from Britain (Daubney 2009, 187). Assuming that the attribution is correct, this coin is therefore of some importance.
