A very worn 14th-century debased silver medieval Irish halfpenny of Edward III (1327-77), dating to 1339-40 coinage, mint: Dublin (Spink S6269; North Group H). Refs: Spink 2003: 128; North 1997: 17.

The coin has suffered some circumferential losses. The wear is differential on the surfaces with the reverse surviving far better.
