A copper alloy zoomorphic plate brooch dating from the Roman period, probably the 2nd century. The brooch is in the form of a running animal (possibly a stag) looking backwards over its shoulder. The snout is rounded; the eye is an incised pointed oval with a circular depression in the centre; the ear is another pointed oval defined by grooves and the back of the head is broken but appears to have had a projection (perhaps antlers). The body is decorated with a recessed cell filling the body and chest. The front leg is defined by moulding; the foreleg is missing. The flank of the back leg is not recessed and the lowers legs are again missing. The edges are rounded and there are transverse notches on the upper back and neck. On the reverse is a corroded double log holding a hinged pin of which only the hinge survives. The catchplate is incomplete and is at the head end. The brooch is similar in shape to an incomplete example in Hattatt, number 1417 on page 363. Compare also NMS-365796 which is also in the form of a backwards facing stag. This design seems unusual and there is only the one parallel on the database. Zoomorphic brooches of hares or hounds are more common.
