There are two narrow arms protruding from one side, apparently incomplete, suggesting that the object was folded back at this point, to create a pin-slot or gap for suspension, as with a buckle plate. A rectangular extension on the opposite side terminates with two small triangular projections, with space for a third (now missing due to old breaks). There is a small rivet hole near the centre of this terminal. There are transverse grooves decorating the surface of the object, and obscured by corrosion. The mount measures 29.68 mm in length, 13.16 mm in width, 1.9 mm in thickness and weighs 2.82 g .
