A copper alloy trumpet brooch dating to the 1st-2nd centuries AD. The brooch has been silvered and is condition, although it is missing the pin and some of the enamel that would have decorated the head, evident from an empty panel. The head is oval in shape, decorated with a raised geometric design enclosed by a raised border. This panel would have contained enamel. The design consists of a central line flanked by two half circles and with a triangle at the bottom. The head is connected to a cylindrical section decorated with horizontal strips then wrap around the cylinder. The bow consists of a rectangular panel decorated with raised prisms, followed by a tapering section that is decorated with two rectangular borders containing raised geometric line. The object terminates in a circular foot and the catch plate is present. It weighs 13.6g and measures 57.06mm in length and the width of the head is 13.78mm.

Parallels can be found in Hattatt, R. (2007) *A Visual Catalogue of Ancient Brooches*, Oxbow: no.'s 955 and 433 and in Mackreth (2011) *Brooches in Late Iron Age and Roman Britain* : vol 1 p119, plate 80. The brooch is possibly a Mackreth type 1.2b7.
