An incomplete cast copper alloy hooked tag of post-medieval date. The hooked tag is of Reads Class E, Type 3 being circular in plan. The main plate is circular with a raised central design of a double rose. A trapezoidal attachment loop projects from the upper edge of the main plate and a worn break is present on the opposite edge from which the hook would have extended. The reverse of the object is concave and undecorated.
The metal has a dark reddish-brown patina and is worn. The hooked tag is 19.3 mm long, 14.4 mm wide, 2.5 mm thick and weighs 1.1 g .
A similar example is illustrated in Read, p.96, no. 345 and are dated to the early post-medieval period.
