

HARNESS MOUNT

Cast copper alloy harness pendant suspension mount dating from the 13th or 14th century AD. The mount is nearly complete, but the harness pendant is missing. The suspension mount consists of a horizontally aligned bar of triangular section. At either end of this bar would have been a narrow transverse ridge which gives way to a perforated lobe with a horizontal knop protruding from the end, but one of the lobes is now missing. Within the remaining lobe's perforation is an *in situ* domed-head rivet, the right hand one of which also has in place a circular stop at the back.

The pendant is missing, but a very similar suspension mount with pendant was recorded on this database under BH-AC4764 and a date range of 13th to early 14th century was suggested.
