# **COIN HOARD**

In August 2003 members of the Sedgeford Historical and Archaeological Research Project (S.H.A.R.P.) discovered 20 Iron Age gold coins concealed within or associated with a cowbone, using a metal-detector in the course of archaeological excavation. The objects were brought to the British Museum for examination on 22 September. 19 further coins were discovered in the vicinity.

All 39 coins belong to the same type. They are so-called 'Gallo-Belgic E' staters, made in the first century BC, probably in northern France. These coins are frequently found in southern Britain where they circulated in large numbers, and where they may also been produced. The coins are made from an alloy of mostly gold and silver, but appear gold.

In the same area since 1997 seven coins of the same type have previously been found by members of the Sedgeford Project. They have all been disclaimed.

As there is clear evidence that the coins were originally buried concealed within the cowbone, it is apparent that they all belong to the same find deposited in antiquity, and that they therefore constitute a prima facie case of Treasure.

#### **Notes:**

The coins fall under the Treasure Act 1996 as they are all more than 300 years old, and there are more than 10 coins in the find, so their precious metal content does not have to be considered
