A fragment of a wheel thrown ceramic vessel of medieval date (1200 - 1400). The fragment is a rim sherd from a probable storage jar or cistern with a gritty, hard reduced light grey fabric. Numerous small homogenous glistening inclusions are present, probably mica. Both the interior and exterior surfaces of the vessel fragment are coated in a light green glaze.

The fragment is 38.7mm long, 34.1mm wide, 4.1mm thick and weighs 7.9g.
