A worn copper-alloy Rose and Orb jetton of Nuremberg Master Iorg Schultes, probably c.1551-1553 AD. As Mitchiner, 1988: nos. 1309-1310.

Obverse: \*IORG.SCHVLTES[], Three crowns and three lis arranged centrifugally around a central rose, all within an inner circle

Reverse: \*IORG.SCHVLTES[], An Imperial orb surmounted by a cross pattee within a double stranded trefoil, all within an inner circle.
