<u>Admiral</u> Augustus Keppel, 1st Viscount Keppel <u>PC</u> (25 April 1725 - 2 October 1786) was an officer of the <u>Royal Navy</u> during the <u>Seven Years' War</u> and the <u>War of American Independence</u>. During the final years of the latter conflict he served as <u>First Lord of the Admiralty</u>.
