Probably medieval or post-medieval sheet copper alloy staple, bent almost straight. The front part was c.25mm long and 7 - 10mm wide. One tapering arm is c.20mm long, the other 28mm. Beyond these the spiked ends add a further 4mm each. Thickness 0.5mm. Perhaps c.1200 - c.1700.
