There is the official mint 'snick' in the edge of the flan at the 1 o'clock position when looking at the obverse of the coin.

This is a new moneyer for the Hereford mint in the reign of Henry I. The Hereford mint has previously been recorded in type 7 from a type 9/7 mule of Wu(l)fric only.
