On the underisde of the bowl, there is a triangular ridge which extends to form the stem. The surviving section of stem is circular in section and is 5mm in length. The object weighs 2.69g. The spoon has an even light green patina. As it has a round spoon bowl, this example can be classified as a Crummy Type 1 (Crummy 1983, 69ff).
