3 sherds of medieval pottery, divided into two fabrics.

1. Two hand thrown pottery sherds dating to the medieval period (1300 to 1450 AD). The fabric is dark grey/black. The fabric is tempered with abundant grog ranging from <0.5mm to 2mm and in white, cream, orange and red/brown. The sherds range from 39 to 47mm across and weigh a total of 29.2 grams.

2. One sherd of hand thrown pottery. The fabric is buff with a orange/red exterior. It has abundant quartz ranging from <0.5mm to 2.5mm and is black, red and cream in colour. There is also occasional quartz. The exterior has an depressed line running horizontally. The sherd is 36mm by 46mm by 9mm and weighs 22.2 grams.
