Medieval cast copper alloy cased mirror of late 13th to mid 14th century date
The mirror is fragmentary, comprising the incomplete half of the case (with an overall length of 44.5 mm and a weight of 6.6 g ). The case was hinged with double perforated lugs ( 6.1 mm deep, 7.0 mm long, 6.7 mm wide, $1.0 \mathrm{~mm}-1.8 \mathrm{~mm}$ thick and with a perforation diameter of 3.0 mm ). On the opposite side of the case is a catch, comprising a single lug ( 4.7 mm deep, 6.4 mm long and 2.4 mm thick) with a notch on its lower edge. The case has a flange ( 3.6 mm deep) around its edge and the flange on the complete side has a transverse rib (giving a width of 33.9 mm ). The flat circular face of the case ( 32.3 mm diameter) is decorated with ribs defined by punched triangle or rectangles on each side. The decoration comprises a border, at the centre of which is a cross and between each arm is a triangle with a central vertice. The interior of the case is undecorated with no evidence for a surviving adhesive. The surface has a dark-green to brown patina.

The cased mirror can be closely paralleled with three examples excavated in London (Egan \& Pritchard, 1991, p 361-2, nos. 1714-6), all from contexts dating between 1270 to 1350.
