Flint borer, of uncertain date, Mesolithic to Neolithic ( $9000 - 2200 \, BC$ ). The flint is a brown colour and is translucent. It is a tertiary flake and is roughly teardrop shaped in plan and flat elliptical in section. The flint has a sharp curved point at the distal end. This point has been produced by minimal short, sub-parallel, semi-abrupt, soft hammer retouch to the left edge of the distal end carried out from the dorsal face. There is also edge damage, or possible very fine retouch on the right side at the proximal end. The flint is  $30.2 \, mm \log x \, 14.5 \, mm$  wide  $x \, 4.2 \, mm$  thick. Weight  $1.2 \, g$ .
