A complete lead or lead alloy unfaced token of Late Medieval to Early Post Medieval dating (AD 1400 to AD 1800).

The token is sub circular. The obverse design is uncertain, but possibly an outer rim or wreath (Powell type 28). The reverse is undecorated. It has been partially folded in half.

The token has a diameter of 17.5 mm and is 2.0 mm thick. It weighs 2.9 g.

The token is a light to mid grey colour, with an even surface patina. Abrasion, caused by movement whilst within the plough soil has resulted in a loss of some of the original surface detail.
