

STRAP END

One side of the plate of a copper alloy Medieval (probably 14th century) strap end. The strap end is broadly rectangular and curved at the tip with four circular perforations, two at the attachment end and two above the curved tip. The front face is decorated with a circumferential groove running along the outer edge and the central section is split into four panels. The top panel is decorated with an incised horned bull facing left. Within the panel are two circular perforations, both rivets are missing. The central section depicts a cinctured boar's head facing left with mouth open. The lower two panels depict two legs, one in each panel to the left of the leg on the left panel and to the right of the leg on the right panel are circular perforations.

The reverse is undecorated.

The strap end is 40.7mm in length, 19.75mm wide, 1.3mm thick and weighs 4.71 grams.
