Two copper-alloy contemporary copies, c. AD 355-361, of the House of Constantine, AD 307-361 (probably/possibly Reece period 18). Reverse legends are illegible. Reverses probably show a soldier spearing a fallen horseman. Mint is uncertain.

Obverse legends are illegible. Obverses show an unclear bust right. Die axis is uncertain for both coins.

A - an incomplete coin: Weight is 0.52g, diameter is 10.4mm, thickness is 1.9mm.

B - a complete coin: Weight is 0.77g, diameter is 9.7mm, thickness is 1.8mm.
