The coin is very worn within the field on both obverse and reverse, with virtually nothing of the design remaining, and the inscriptions are only partial given its status as a cut fraction. The lettering on the reverse is worn and difficult to read in its entirety, the moneyer reading only [...]OL[...]with certainty. It may be GOL[...], which could suggest the moneyer is Goldric of Stafford (possibly STAEFOR, for which FOR is distinctly visible).
