An incomplete copper-alloy pot leg from a cooking vessel of medieval to post-medieval date (1100-1800AD). The fragment is sub-triangular in cross-section, with a deep concave inner surface. The leg is broken just above the foot and the break is worn most likely through post-depositional processes. The foot protrudes and then tapers downwards towards a point; it consists of four conjoined convex ribs running from the leg to this point. This would have been one of three legs with size and form suggesting it was part of a cauldron or large later-form posnet (Butler, Green and Payne 2009, p.2).

The metal is rough and a red-brown colour with some light green patches. The fragment is 53.90mm in length, 34.67mm wide, 29.07mm thick and weighs 108g.

Copper alloy vessels were commonly used for cooking from AD1100 to the late 1700s where they were gradually phased out in favour of cast-iron pots and saucepans designed for kitchen ranges. Therefore it is difficult to closely date this object without any further archaeological context. Cooking vessels were cast using two piece moulds until the late 17th century and the introduction of sand-casting. Skillets could be cast using one piece moulding. Legs and handles were created in a single cast together with the body.
