Late Neolithic-Early Bronze Age side and end scraper, this has three large flake removals from the dorsal side and a large bulb of percussion on the ventral. Running around the forward edge and down the right side are direct, abrupt, scaled retouch creating a curved working edge. Very dark grey flint with light grey patches.
