An incomplete copper alloy probable early medieval small long brooch. Only the foot plate and a small section of the bow survives. The plate is formed from a central lozenge with a triangular section expanding outwards at either end. Its outer face is decorated with an incised ring and dot at each corner and a longitudinal row of three ring and dots in the centre. The base of a bow extends from one end. This is very narrow and D-shaped in cross-section. Extending from the same end to the reverse is a small rectangular catch-plate, its end turned over to form a hook. The surface of the metal is heavily corroded.
