Copper alloy pin dating from the Middle or Later Iron Age, probably c. 400-200BC. The pin is complete and in extremely good condition. The surfaces are not very worn and the patina is smooth and of dark brown colour. There is some corrosion/corrosive patches along lower part of the stem, but the ring head shows little corrosion/damage. The stem is short, with a small diameter while the ring head is heavy with a larger diameter. The ring head was integrally cast, i.e. both stem and head were cast in one rather than the ring being bent around to touch the stem. The ring is decorated with three evenly spaced moulded balls and there are smaller collar mouldings on either side of the balls as well as on either of the stem where it is connected to the ring head. It only appears to have been decorated with moulded decoration; there is no evidence or enamel or coral inlays.
