

# SCRAPER (TOOL)

Object type certainty: Certain

A complete knapped lithic implement of late Neolithic to early Bronze Age date, circa 2700 - 1600 BC. The implement is a scraper formed from a tertiary flake which is fan-shaped with an ovate section. The ventral surface is smooth with a bulbar scar and ripples of percussion. The dorsal surface is irregular displaying long, sub-parallel retouch on the distal edge.

The flint is a dark grey colour. The implement is 32mm long, 36.1mm wide, 7.3mm thick and weighs 8.1g.
