# **SLEEVE CLASP**

Unique ID: YORYM-87BB61

Object type certainty: Certain Workflow status: Published

An incomplete copper-alloy wrist or sleeve clasp of Early-Medieval date, c.AD 450 - 570. Hines Form B18c, cast in one piece. The clasp consists of a rectangular plate with a raised bar along one long straight edge and one curvilinear edge forming five roundels, with four perforations, or sewing holes, for attachment between the bar and the roundels. The bar is decorated with perhaps eight broad transverse grooves alternating with double narrow grooves. The reverse of the clasp is flat and undecorated though the worn remains of a hook project from the centre of the straight edge.

The metal has a mid-green patina and is worn. The clasp is 35.2mm long, 15mm wide, 2.9mm thick and weighs 4.9g.

Hines (1993, p.59) discusses Form 18c sleeve clasps as being particularly popular in the north of England and describes the available dating evidence for this form as "disappointing".

Wrist clasps have been studied and classified by Hines (1993) and Penn and Brugmann (2007). Hines three levels of classification suggests a date range of late 5th to 6th century for these objects. Penn and Brugmann's chronological study of selected East Anglian grave-good types included a small sample size of wrist clasps which limited their suggested dating to the mid-to late 5th century.

As these systems have not been completely reconciled it seems reasonable to give all wrist-clasps a wide date-range of c.AD 450-570 (see <a href="https://finds.org.uk/counties/findsrecordingguides/wrist-clasps/">https://finds.org.uk/counties/findsrecordingguides/wrist-clasps/</a>).
