Reverse description: Cross pattee flanked by pellet left and annulet right, two pellets and semi-circular figure below cross, H-shaped object above it with further scattered bars and pellets. The impression is of either scattered elements of a 'TOT' standard; or [inverted] a bird on a cross with only the lower part of the bird's rump visible, possibly with garbled legend outside the arrangement.
