The seal is formed of a central disc surrounded by an attached concentric strip. The legend on the obverse can probably be reconstructed as '[WILL] / [K]NIP[E] / [P]ACK[ER]' in three lines. The centre of the reverse has scratched markings reading 'IIV' or 'IIW'. The cloth seal measures 23mm in diameter, 2.5mm in thickness and weighs 5.1 grams.

For a similar packer's seal recorded on the Portable Antiquities Scheme database, see SUR-7E7126. The National Archives contains a lease of 30 June 1739, which refers to William Knipe of London, packer, as well as his will, proved 1748.
