Two fragments of a high tinned copper-alloy unidentified object of uncertain date.

The larger fragment was in two pieces when found but has been glued back together by the finder. It is sub-rectangular in plan, tapering from one end to the other, with a faceted curved section.

Dimensions: 50.6mm x 13.3mm x 1.8mm; 6.6g.

The smaller fragment is also sub-rectangular in plan, tapering from one end to the other, with a more defined faceted curved section. Moulded transverse banding decorates one terminal.

Dimensions: 31.8mm x 13.8mm x 1.7mm; 6.3g.
