An incomplete early Roman cast copper-alloy T-shaped brooch, dating to the 1st-2nd century AD. Cylindrical wings hold the pin axis bar; there is a slot in the centre of the wings at the rear for the now missing pin. The head of the bow has a ridge and groove running down to the foot either side of the bow edge. The catchplate is incomplete.
