The bow is then slightly constricted before an equally slight expansion over a possibly eroded moulding, and a more definite mid bow moulding which, like the others, does not pass all around the bow. There is the suspicion of a horizontal groove between this and another vaguely defined moulding after which the lower bow tapers once again. The foot is lost, though the very top of the stub of a catch plate remains. Abraded. Suggested date: Early Roman, 100-180
