The fragment is sub-rectangular in plan and is curved in cross-section. The surface and core are orange-red in colour. The tile has occasional white quartz inclusions, and is micaceous.

The tile is 57 mm in maximum length, 51.7 mm in maximum width, 19 mm in thickness, and weighs 80.07g.
