A lead spindle whorl of probable Post Medieval date, AD 1500 - 1600. It is circular and biconvex (Walton Rogers Form C2) and decorated on both faces with raised pellets. The whorl has a well developed white patina. The central hole is 10.1mm diameter. Walton Rogers cites Ivens et al (1995) in suggesting that whorls with dots are Post Medieval. The whorl is 25.1mm in diameter and 13.6mm thick. It weighs 31.47g.
