Description: The object is formed from a sheet metal lozenge plate with a strip of sheet copperalloy rivet to the back at the apex of each point. The upper surface. The upper surface of the sheet metal plate has the petals and details of a flower incised onto it, some additional petal details are picked out with circular punching. The object is fairly heavily patinated with a light green patination. One end of the loop has been detached and the entire object is slightly warped.

Measurements: 23.5mm long, 20.18mm wide, 15.36mm thick (including folded over back loop, 1.44mm thick and 4.85g in weight.
