A flint scraper of probable Neolithic date, 4000 BC - 2200 BC. It is formed on a tertiary flake of tan flint. It is roughly D shaped with short, abrupt, sub-parallel retouch on the left side. It is 18.9mm long, 12.2mm wide and 4.6mm thick. 0.9g.
