An incomplete copper alloy Eagle mount or figurine, of probable Post Medieval or later dating, AD 1700 to AD 1900.

Around 50% of the eagle is present, as one wing is missing. The base is incomplete.

The eagle is stood, with wings outstretched and head bent over to the right hand side. Legs are positioned together. The surviving wing is almost triangular in shape, the wing tip is missing. The feet are stood on a circular collared base, with a circular attachment scar underneath. The reverse of the eagle is similar to the front.

It measures 68.4 mm tall, 44.8 mm wide and 11.4 mm thick. It weighs 62.7 g.

The eagle is a mid green colour, with an even surface patina. Abrasion, caused by movement whilst within the plough soil, has resulted in a loss of some of the original surface detail.

No direct parallel has been found at the time of recording. DENO-A5D203, WMID-6FF204 and LIN-AD2980 are similar in style mounts, although the pose of the eagle is different. It is reasonable to assume that this eagle came from a mount or possibly a pipe tamper.
