A Medieval silver penny of Richard I (AD 1189-99) or John (AD 1199-1216), Group I, class ii (North 972/2) dating from c. AD 1190-pre-1205, moneyer: Halli mint: Rhuddlan. Ref: North 1994: 221.

The coin is struck on a slightly irregular flan and is worn, especially on the obverse.

The coin is 20.62mm in diameter, 0.82mm thick and weighs 1.2g.

Notes:

In contrast to the overall 'short cross' series, the coins of the Rhuddlan mint are rare finds, with fewer than 100 currently recorded by the PAS (April 2021).
